Minutes of the Board of Health

November 3, 2016

ROLL CALL: A regular meeting of the Allendale Board of Health was held in the Municipal Building on the above date. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Bruce Beck.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The October 2015 Minutes were accepted with a motion to approve by Linda Morgan and seconded by Nadine Benoit.

SECRETARY/REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Adult Health Clinic – No Adult Health Clinic was held.

Child Health Clinic – No children attended the Child Health Clinic.

HEALTH OFFICER/SANITARY REPORTS

-Performed Chapter 24 at the Allendale Octoberfest.

-Inspected the Allendale Nursing Home. Scheduled a reinspection

because their indirect waste setup was not directly connected to their sanitary sewer (evidently a break in the pipe) which means if there is a backup it goes onto the floor and not into the sink. Also the three compartment sink needs to be reinspected. All of the above was discussed with the manager and will be abated.

-The outbreak of Scabies at the nursing home is under control.

-The Board of Health received a complaint about Nostramana. Upon inspection, the complaint was totally unfounded as the kitchen is spotless and food exceptionally fresh. They posted satisfactory. It would seem that the complainant had the Norovirus.

-Received a complaint of rodents at 221 W. Crescent Avenue. The house is in the process of being sold and will be demolished soon after. Evidently the greenery is slightly overgrown and rodents were seen in the wooded area at the rear of the property. The owner-to-be has agreed to bait the property. No additional complaints were received.

-At the Doggie Day Care in Waldwick two dogs started to fight and the technician was bitten while trying to separate them. However, she did not know which dog bit her. One of the dogs was from Allendale and the other from Glen Rock. After checking to make sure both animals were current with their rabies shot, both dogs had to be quarantined and were released after ten days.

-Complaint received from a tenant at the Allendale Hotel. The Board of Health contacted the building superintendent and asked about the leak as the tenant was concerned that the leak may cause a structural issue. The superintendent gave me a copy of a report showing that the Allendale Hotel was recently inspected by the State and was satisfactory report with no issues. However, the complaint was referred to the State Housing Authority in Trenton, via fax.

-The rabies vaccine was picked up in Teterboro and delivered to Allendale by our sanitarian for our clinic. Tyco provides a technician who assists the Allendale veterinarian. This is included in our contract.

-A question was asked about Deer control. Unfortunately, Allendale does not have enough vacant acreage to consider a program.

-Inspected Dunkin Donuts and posted satisfactory.

-Acme - Performed Chapter 24 and were satisfactory.

-Bernie's Bagels – Reinspection- observed their indirect waste which was satisfactory.

-Allendale Eats – Performed a Chapter 24 – posted same satisfactory.

-Acme Supermarket – Golden Sushi posted satisfactory.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

-Thirty-seven adults attended the Allendale Flu Clinic, 16 employees, 4 volunteers and 17 residents.
