APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

SECRETARY/REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Adult Health Clinic - No Adult Health Clinic was held.

Child Health Clinic - No children attended the Child Health Clinic.

Vital Statistics – 3 Deaths 0 Births and 0 Marriages.

Public Health Report – Reportable Diseases for March and April 2017.

HEALTH OFFICER/SANITARY REPORTS

-Complaint was received regarding the Masa Sushi grease trap container which was leaking onto the ground. Consulted with the owner who ordered a new one. Observed same and problem was abated.

-Dairy Queen was satisfactory. However, they were reinspected because of an Indirect waste disposal problem which was corrected.

-The daughter of a resident on Crescent Avenue called to complain about vermin on her parent's property which borders Ramsey. She mentioned that Ramsey's DPW was out checking sewers/storm drains and it appears that the property she is referring to is in Ramsey, not Allendale.

-Consulted with the building department and Jean regarding the Bonding and Grounding Certificate for the The Whitney pool. Checked with the management company and our files and none was found. Therefore, before they are allowed to open they will need a new five-year Bonding and

Grounding Certificate as well as an electrical inspection. Consulted with pool management company twice to set up an appointment for pre-opening inspection.

-Dog bite at residence on Myrtle Avenue. Completed paperwork, confinement of animal and same was forwarded to Inspector Dunne for follow up.

-Allendale Community for Senior Living had a power outage overnight. Backup generators maintained adequate refrigeration temperatures.

-Inspected Allendale Eats and they posted satisfactory.

-Performed Chapter 24 at the Allendale Nursing Home and were posted satisfactory.

-Reinspected Asian Cuisine after four previous violations. All were abated and they posted satisfactory.

-Inspected Northern Highlands H.S. cafeteria and they were satisfactory.

-A bed bug problem at a private residence on Myrtle Avenue was reported to the Board of Health. It is still a problem even though the owner had an exterminator come. However, he cannot continue to pay for another visit. An attempt was made to obtain some services for him, but, unfortunately, to no avail.

-The Flu is still surfacing in and around Bergen County.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

-Crestwood Lake will be opening Memorial Day weekend and an inspection will be scheduled shortly.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT


-Nothing new to report.
