Minutes of the Board of Health

May 1, 2014

ROLL CALL: A regular meeting of the Allendale Board of Health was held in the Municipal Building on the above date. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Bruce Beck, President.

The following members were present: Nadine Benoit, Linda Morgan, Maria Crean, Robin Iversen, Susan Toron and Christopher Martin. Also present was Linda Quinn, our sanitarian.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The April 2014 Minutes were accepted with a motion to approve by Robin Iversen and seconded by Maria Crean.

SECRETARY/REGISTRAR'S REPORT:

Adult Health Clinic – No adult health clinic was held

Child Health Clinic – No children attended.

Vital Statistics – 2 Marriages, 6 Deaths, 1 Birth

Receipts - \$56.00 in Marriage Licenses, \$30.00 in Certified Copies, \$450.00 in Miscellaneous, totaling \$536.00.

COMMUNICATIONS/CORRESPONDENCE

-Ordering 100 doses of rabies vaccine for Free Rabies Clinic.

HEALTH OFFICER/SANITARY REPORTS

-Allendale Eats had a sewage backup. Board of Health was not notified until a few days later. Upon inspection, they sanitized and clean up properly.

-Mezza Luna has a whole new downstairs dining room with two brand new bathrooms. However, the kitchen is not big enough to handle additional traffic and must be expanded. New plans are in the works which will enable them to operate properly.

-We understand that Pastafino will be reopening in the not-to-distant future.

-Farmer's Market - Vendors are questioning whether or not there is refrigeration and electrical hookups at the Farmer's Market. One vendor, in particular, is making apple pies. We asked where these pies are going to be made and they responded by saying they will be using their church kitchen. They were informed that they have to let us know the town and name of the church to make sure it has a commercial kitchen that is inspected by the health department before they begin selling their pies to the public. They were also told that it is mandatory that they obtain a food handler's certification. Additionally, if sandwiches and gyros are going to be prepared, a hand-wash sink will be required in the food preparation area.

-We understand that Northern Highlands High School has food trucks come to sell lunches to the students. Our sanitarian will look into this.

-The library is contemplating selling bottled water. No food license would be required since the water is pre-packaged and sealed.

-Crestwood Lake will be opening in a month with several new additions such as kayaking, a waterslide, a spouting fountain, a pavillion which will provide shade while you eat and, in addition, a new cleared out wooded area for a cool spot to relax.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS

-The Ambulance Corps will be carrying Narcan which is used for a drug overdose. A waiver has been obtained by the State for EMS and First Responders such as our Police Department etc. to administer it. Training at Northern Highlands High School will take place Monday night and once same is completed, the drug will be ordered. Narcan is an inter-nasal spray and reverses the effects of drugs.
