**RESOLUTION CALLING FOR STUDY COMMISSION  
TO REVIEW THE OPEN PUBLIC RECORDS ACT**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Allendale strongly believes in and supports open transparent government, and that citizens and residents have the right to be informed about the workings of government in order to best participate in a democracy; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 8, 2002 then Acting Governor DiFrancesco signed into law the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) which mandates that government records shall be available, with limited exceptions, for public access and simplifying the procedures for requesting such specific records; and

**WHEREAS**, the intent of the law was to provide the public with easy access to government records with an uncomplicated process for obtaining the records and eliminating bureaucratic red tape; and

**WHEREAS**, over the course of 18 years OPRA has been a positive light, but it has also been fraught with abuse and misuse, and has become an unanticipated financial cost to the taxpayers of New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Allendale has labored under a well-intended law that has spiraled out of control, due to the volume and nature of requests, the cost to taxpayers in responding to the requests, and the potential liability in having to pay disproportionate prevailing party attorney's fees should the requests turn into litigated matters, as well as the liability in determining which documents shall be released, with or without redaction, while attempting to maintain individual privacy; and

**WHEREAS**, it is not only the volume of OPRA requests that challenge our resources, but it is also the cost associated with reviewing, retrieving, and processing the OPRA request(s) by public entity personnel and counsel and possibly defending our action(s) before the Government Records Council or in Superior Court; and

**WHEREAS**, Borough of Allendale received and responded to 295 OPRA requests in 2017, 450 in 2018, and to date has received and responded to 428 requests as of November 1, 2019; and

**WHEREAS**, considerable time during each business day is dedicated by Borough of Allendale staff for responding to OPRA requests; and

**WHEREAS**, due to the often-conflicting case law and Government Record Council decisions, as well as the unique characteristics of OPRA request, the Borough of Allendale must often times rely on the municipal attorney to review certain OPRA requests, resulting in time focused on these matters instead of addressing other important Borough matters; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2018, alone, the Borough of Allendale received over 200 OPRA requests for copies of police reports from professionals seeking to promote their businesses' services; and

**WHEREAS**, with limited exceptions OPRA has not been amended to address the clear and apparent advancement in technology that has changed the way government records are created, stored, and/or transmitted; the various interpretive decisions; privacy concerns; abuse for commercial gain; and/or the ever-increasing cost to taxpayers; and

**WHEREAS**, as the current law approaches its twentieth (20<sup>th</sup>) anniversary it has outgrown its original intended use and has become ripe for comprehensive review and reform;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the governing body of the Borough of Allendale appeals to the legislature to form a Commission comprised of Mayors, Municipal Clerks, Municipal Managers, Attorneys, Police Chiefs, open government advocates, privacy experts, members of the media, citizens and other appropriate stakeholders, to review and examine the effects of OPRA on local government and the needs to be fulfilled by the law, and use the Commission's findings to perform a comprehensive reform of OPRA; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that copies of this resolution be forwarded to Senator Kristin Corrado, Assemblymembers Kevin Rooney and Christopher DePhillips, Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin, Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Senator Weinberg, Executive Director of the Government Records Council, the Governor of the State of New Jersey, the Municipal Clerks Association of New Jersey and New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

**REQUEST COUNTY OF BERGEN DEVELOP A  
WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT & ACTION PLAN**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Allendale is a municipality with a population of approximately 6,800 residents located on 3 square miles in Northwest Bergen County, New Jersey; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Allendale recognizes the importance of maintaining open space not only for recreation purposes, but for conservation and environmental sustainability; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Allendale has demonstrated its commitment to conservation by preserving 71 acres known as Crestwood Park, 107 acres known as the Celery Farm Preserve as well as other wooded areas and parklands within the Borough; and

**WHEREAS**, adjacent municipalities in Northwest Bergen County have substantial wooded areas and parklands; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Bergen has nearly 9,000 acres of parkland, almost half of which are located within five miles of the Borough of Allendale; and

**WHEREAS**, diverse wildlife including birds, mammals, fish, reptiles, insects, non-predatory and predatory animals inhabit these areas; and

**WHEREAS**, wildlife management is essential for the conversation of wildlife species, including control of overabundant predatory and non-predatory species whose populations can cause environmental imbalance and harm to other wildlife as well as to human beings; and

**WHEREAS**, wildlife management requires cooperation of governmental entities beyond the borders of individual municipalities and can be effective when implemented in collaboration with public land stewards on all levels, especially beyond individual municipalities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Allendale has taken action to address wildlife management; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of New Jersey, Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Fish and Wildlife has adopted a Statewide Wildlife Action Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Bergen maintains recreation and conservation areas throughout the entire county but has not adopted a Wildlife Action Plan for Bergen County to manage diverse habitats and to control species diversity in close proximity to the human population; and

**WHEREAS**, there is an over-population of certain wildlife species; and

**WHEREAS**, the overpopulation of wildlife species such as coyotes has led to recent attacks and caused injuries, not only to wildlife animals, but also to human beings and domestic animals in Northern Bergen County; and

**WHEREAS**, the overpopulation of deer has denuded our wooded areas and causes approximately 26,000 vehicle accidents annually in New Jersey, including some resulting in the death of drivers; and

**WHEREAS**, funding and grants to develop Wildlife Management and Action Plans may be available.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Allendale that the Borough requests the County of Bergen to prepare a Wildlife Management and Action Plan which will provide for both conservation of wildlife and control of predatory and non-predatory wildlife populations on all county and municipal recreation and conservation properties.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Bergen County Executive James Tedesco, Bergen County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Senator Kristin Corrado, Assemblymembers Kevin Rooney and Christopher DePhillips, Allendale's Animal Control Officer and the 13 municipalities that comprise Northwest Bergen County.



**Whereas**, there is a need for a Municipal Court Administrator in the Borough of Allendale; and
